<b>STUDENTS</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Save money on college tuition.             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>◦ Decrease student loan debt.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• The program offers up to <u>21</u> courses/<u>63</u> credits.             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>◦ All credits can be transferred to HBCUs, Ivy Leagues and participating collegiate institutions.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Close observation by HBCUs, Ivy Leagues, participating collegiate institutions and other sponsors.             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>◦ Scholarship bids &gt; <b>IN/OUT-SOURCE</b> (explained later).</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Better job opportunities after high school graduation for having courses completed (fast track to associate degree).             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>◦ Internship opportunities                 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Starting an internship early gives students more experience at the end of college graduation.                     <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <i>Imagine graduating at the age of 20 and already having 4 years of experience?!!</i></li> </ul> </li> </ul> </li> </ul> </li> <li>• Paid Peer tutoring for current high school classes.</li> <li>• Increases competition at institutions upon senior graduation due to approved curriculum.</li> </ul>
<b>TEACHERS</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Gain teaching experience opportunities with just a Bachelors.</li> <li>• Multiple teachers can teach one course.             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>◦ Break course down &gt; one teacher per week, unless one teacher bids on all 10 weeks for a course.                 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Allows students to interact with multiple styles.</li> </ul> </li> </ul> </li> <li>• Upload lesson recordings.             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>◦ Teachers can upload pre-recorded/edited videos for their lessons.                 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Must be seen and clearly heard in the videos.</li> </ul> </li> </ul> </li> <li>• Students can insert a question (recording or text) in the recording.             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>◦ Question and response will post under the recording as public.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Teachers can ask a question during the recordings.             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>◦ Students must provide a response that's posted under the recording as public.                 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ These can be graded.                     <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Responses can't be seen by other students until 2 days after. This stops from repeating answers from other students and not thinking for self.</li> </ul> </li> </ul> </li> </ul> </li> <li>• Quiz after each recording.             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>◦ These can be graded.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
<b>INSTITUTIONS</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Affirmative Action</b> isn't a factor.             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>◦ Non-bias student search filters.</li> <li>◦ Non-bias learning.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Institutions can log into their portal and use filters to get a list of desired students.             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>◦ Students are listed as an alpha-numeric pattern to remove bias.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Ability to send messages to the student about future opportunities and/or internships.</li> <li>• Institutions can use our academic system to place scholarship bids on current students enrolled in the program while checking their status in the program.             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>◦ There are two different kinds of scholarships:                 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ <b>IN-SOURCE</b> &gt; Scholarships are given to the program to help pay tuition for that student.</li> <li>▪ <b>OUT-SOURCE</b> &gt; Scholarships handled by the awarding-institution, usually given to seniors.</li> </ul> </li> </ul> </li> <li>• Increase enrollment without financial burden of constructing more dorms and classrooms on already-establish campuses.</li> <li>• Great way of showing students the institutions care more about them receiving an education than making money of their need for an education in order to obtain a career/employment.</li> </ul>
